


# Mothers Day Craft Ideas

## Flower Box:

### You will need:

Coloured cardboard  
12 Paddle Pop Sticks  
Scissors  
Egg Carton  
Glue or Sticky Tape  
Texters



Pick a flower and you will  
see the jobs you'll pick this  
week for me

### How to make Flower Box:

Draw and cut out 12 flowers from different coloured cardboard or print our flowers template on page 3 onto different coloured cardboard or white paper and colour in.

Draw and cut out leaves from green cardboard or print our leaves template on page 4 onto green paper, cardboard or white paper and colour in.

On the back of the flowers write different chores/jobs or nice things you want to do for mum.

Glue or sticky tape the flowers and leaves to the paddle pop sticks

Make small cuts into each egg holder in the carton (you may need to ask an adult to do this)

Arrange the "flowers" into position by pushing the paddle pop sticks through the cuts in the carton

Write a card to go with your flower box and inscribe with the message 'Pick a flower and you will see the jobs you'll pick this week for me' and sign.

### Note:

You can use Cup Cake Papers for your Flower Box instead of cutting out cardboard flowers and leaves. Simply flatten the cup cake papers, write your messages or chores onto the papers, then sticky tape them to the paddle pop sticks and 'plant' into your egg carton as per the instructions above.

# Flower Posy:

## You will need:

Cup Cake Papers  
Drinking Straws  
Sticky Tape  
Ribbon for tying the bunch together



## How to make Flower Posy:

Flatten cup cake papers. Decorate cup cake papers – you can colour them, draw pictures on them, write messages in each one, paste glitter/stickers on them etc.

Sticky Tape the cup cake papers onto the straws at one end.

Arrange the “flowers” into a posy and tie using ribbon

# Kitchen Angel:

## You will need:

15cm paper doily  
Spring-action clothes peg  
Glue  
Photo  
Magnetic tape, 4cm long  
Gold pipe cleaner  
Gold foil paper

When you are having one of those days, make a point of glancing at the fridge to remember that although your children aren't always angels, sometimes they come pretty close.



## How to make your Kitchen Angel:

Fold the doily in half and then half again, to form a cone shape. Point the clothespeg closed-side down. Glue the doily onto the top prong, forming the angel's dress.

Cut a head out of a photo, then glue it onto the point of the doily.

Glue magnetic tape onto the back of the clothespin. Wrap one end of the pipe cleaner around the bottom prong of the clothespin, shape into a halo, and trim.

Cut the gold foil paper to resemble wings and glue onto the back of the clothespeg's top prong.

Clip blank paper to the clothespin mouth beneath the skirt for holding messages.
